From the students side we felt that if we can have an active student placement cell which gives the student the opportunity of visiting the companies of interest themselves through institution with management's support would be beneficial and because of this students can have an opportunity to directly get information of the required skills, expected courses and the level of thinking to get hired to be in par with the industry.

❖ External Member

Mr.Sai sabarish, Project Engineer, MEL Systems and services Pvt. Ltd, stated that students are being given an experience of corporate culture by the college, so that they can gain a real sense of how professional workplaces function before stepping into one. They are also being trained to know what is expected from them by companies — in terms of skills, attitude, and professionalism — so that they can be well-prepared in advance. In addition, students are being trained in interview techniques, so that they can present themselves confidently and effectively

during placement interviews. Lastly, internship experiences related to their respective domains are being provided to students, through which hands-on, practical exposure is being gained in their chosen field.
